Highlights

2-stage Public Procurement Study: Focus Soft Measures to support the public procurement of timber buildings

- Second study phase: researcher has collected information on policy measures in use in Austria,
 Czech, Finland, Germany, Slovenia, Spain and France. At the moment, the analysis of interviews is ongoing.
- Results were already discussed within the Sub-Group on Public Procurement on 14 March 2025.
- Some preliminary findings are:
 - Increasing focus on low-carbon technology while remaining technology-neutral when it comes to the offered solutions.
 - Increased focus on renewability and circularity.
 - o **Insufficient skills** in wood construction among procurement professionals. Competence centres also need to build up such knowledge to offer capacity building for procurers.
 - EU Carbon Removal Certification Framework might have an (in)direct impact on procurement policies. How this will be implemented on Member State level remains to be seen.
- The study will be handed over to the WoodPoP Secretariat in May and finalised in June 2025.



Policy Brief: The wood-based sector (WBS)

- 8 million employees
- a key player in the transition towards a more innovative, inclusive, and sustainable society,
 specifically contributing to rural jobs

The challenge:

- significant need for skilled labour that could bring about optimal transformation of the sector.
 - The labour force in wood-based industry is increasingly leaving the sector (e.g. retirement),
 real concern that skills needed are getting lost.
 - wood education and research infrastructure offers a good foundation, but new skills are
 urgently (digitalisation and sustainability, leading to new materials technologies, circular
 business models, interpersonal and managerial skills, etc.)
- > Training, upskilling and reskilling of the labour force is therefore a priority







Policy Brief: How to fulfill the requirements of ever-changing knowledge and skills landscape?

- Upskilling and reskilling of employees in the woodworking industry across different profiles and backgrounds,
 - combining proven traditional with modern IT-supported approaches
 - modernly designed education programs and well-equipped educational facilities at all levels,
 - stimulate enrolment in these programs from the primary to the tertiary level
 - co-finance modern pedagogical research equipment for the implementation of practical training
 - Support the acquisition of woodworking skills in other educational and study programmes educational partnerships
- Mutual recognition of diplomas and training across countries
 - Microcredentials are recognised as one of the tools
- A well-prepared, coordinated and persisting campaign on the WBS being a good professional and personal choice

Highlight - WoodPoP Award

- At a productive meeting in Prague on 10 March it was agreed to set up the Steering Group for the preparations of the Award, which meets regularly.
- 4 categories:
 - a) Residential buildings
 - b) Public buildings
 - c) Infrastructure and commercial buildings
 - d) Innovative wood aplication (applied research)
- Frequency should be **biennial**, professionals with constructed buildings from **2026**, students with proposals from 2027
- First final ceremony will be part of the WoodPoP HLM in Q4 2026







Highlight - WoodPoP Award

- Name of the award will be selected by online vote (suggestions for names until mid-April to TWG Communication)
- Candidates will be nominated by WoodPoP member states
- Winners will be selected by combination of professional jury and general public via website
- Awards:
 - a) 3 awards by professional jury for each of 3 categories of buildings and renovations
 - b) 1 public award for all 3 categories of buildings and renovations together
 - c) 1 special award for innovative wood application (applied research)







Proposed timeline of the WoodPoP Award

- Call for proposals/projects October 2025
- Submission of projects 1 May 2026
- Check of prerequisites by Steering Group/TWG May/June 2026
- Submission of documents to jury until end of June 2026
- Jury work completed until mid-September 2026
- Public vote starts end of July 2026
- Public vote ends end of September 2026
- Informing of the winners end of September 2026
- Ceremony November or December 2026








Plans for 2025





- . Dashboard icon: Clicking this icon will return you to the dashboard
- . Files icon: Clicking this icon will direct you to the files within the WoodPoP Cloud. You will find here the Technical Working Group folders, EGM and HLM folders among the other folders that contain files shared within WoodPoP. (More on III. Files
- . Talk icon: Clicking this icon will direct you to the Talk- the chat/messaging feature of the WoodPoP Cloud. You will find chat channels for each Technical Working Group and chat messages here. (More on Chapter IV. Talk)

- . I am in the WoodPoP Cloud's Folders portion, and I cannot see the Technical Working Group folders.
 - o If you cannot see the Technical Working Group folders, your account may not have been assigned to your respective Technical Working Group. Like the account activation, assignation to a Technical Working Group is also a manual process. Kindly email the WoodPoP Secretariat to assign you to the Technical Working Group folders that you wish to access.
- · I forgot my password. What should I do?
 - There are two ways. The first way is via the "Forgot password?" route on the log-in page of the WoodPoP Cloud. If this does not work, send an email to contact@woodpop.eu for assistance.
- . Is it possible for my group to work on Word documents and slide presentations directly/in real time on the WoodPoP Cloud?
 - o In theory, working and editing files in real-time in the cloud is part of the abilities of the WoodPoP Cloud. However, upon testing this capability at the Wood Policy Laboratory in Traunkirchen last July 3 - 5, 2024, it was found that working on the Cloud in real-time with a big group slows down the Cloud. This may lead to server crashing or file corruption.
 - It is also not ideal to upload Microsoft Office Files (MS Word/.docx, MS PowerPoint file/.pptx, MS Excel file/.xlsx) to the Cloud and work on it because of system incompatibilities that lead to formatting disruption. Using and uploading files created from another office software suite called "OpenOffice". OpenOffice Files (OpenOffice Text Document/.odt, OpenOffice Presentation/.odp, OpenOffice Spreadsheet/.ods) seem to work best but rarely anyone works using the OpenOffice software.







EMG: Food for thought

Taking into account the strategy for outreach activities towards EU institutions, the following key areas need to be developed within woodPoP in order to build a strong foundation for the future:

- 1. Improving the operational structure: Clarify roles within woodPoP and establishing close cooperation between Technical Working Groups (TWGs) transversal & vertical and creating specialised councils for enhanced cooperation (e.g. science, industry).
- 2. Communication strategies: Develop insights on how to engage EU institutions and streamline information flow between stakeholders, decision makers and operational groups. The delivery structure will be refined.
- 3. Enhancing participation: Discuss upcoming meetings, travel plans and the use of conferences to enhance cooperation and outreach.
- 4. Stakeholder engagement: Ensure active contribution and benefit for all members, including government representatives, agencies and industry leaders. Develop and communicate the structure to avoid frustration.
- 5. Future Roadmap: Propose clear deliverables and frameworks, including a roadmap, to ensure long-term impact.
